ATTACHMENT REGARDING QUESTION 20(c)

I tried the *Alder* case in 2012. My client won, and the defendants appealed to the Alaska Supreme Court. I represented Mr. Alder on appeal, and he prevailed.

Although CourtView reflects the case as closed, I am aware that the *Alder* case is still active in the context of collection efforts. However, I am no longer representing Mr. Alder, as the collection case remained with my former law firm when I left to start my own practice.
