I believe my breadth of experience as a lawyer, together with my six years as a federal magistrate judge, has prepared me well for the job of superior court judge. While there is always a learning curve for a new position, I have the experience and the ability to assume the position with a minimal transition period.

Juneau has a very busy court, and it is crucial to be able to manage a heavy flow of work efficiently. I supervised a busy public defender's office for more than five years, and I know how to stay on top of a busy workload. I am not afraid of hard work.

In six years as a judge I have learned a great deal about how to manage a courtroom and about the basic business of judging. The skills I have developed would serve me well in Superior Court. My position as a magistrate judge involves many of the same responsibilities faced by superior court judges. I hear all aspects of felony

cases prior to trial. I am frequently called upon to decide the credibility of witnesses, to deal with difficult people in the courtroom in stressful situations, and to decide complex legal issues.

In my career as a lawyer, I have handled virtually every type of case that comes before the Superior Court, including criminal cases up to the most serious felony cases, divorce and child custody cases, child in need of aid cases, juvenile delinquency matters, personal injury cases on both the plaintiff and defense side, and a variety of areas. I have the experience and breadth of knowledge of the law necessary to decide cases in all the areas that come before the court.

As a lawyer and a judge I have always tried to treat everyone -- opposing witnesses, lawyers, judges, crime victims and criminal defendants -- with respect. One of the primary goals of judges should be to attempt to conduct a proceeding which everyone involved will leave feeling as though they were allowed to have their say and they were treated with respect and allowed to maintain their dignity. Although it is not always possible to achieve this goal, it must be the ideal toward which courts strive.

I believe my twenty three years experience as a lawyer and a judge have given me insight into the wide range of issues which come before the Superior Court. I have found the job of a judge to be extremely satisfying, and would look forward to the new challenges the position of Superior Court Judge would present.

I spent almost 10 years as a public defender, supervising the public defender offices in Juneau and Kodiak, and the remainder of my career in private practice. Since 2000 I have had the privilege of serving as a part time United States Magistrate Judge. I have also served for the past two years on the Board of Governors of the Alaska Bar Association.

In my private practice, I have done criminal defense, plaintiff's personal injury, workers' compensation, insurance defense, family law, and appellate practice.

I am now in solo practice. Most of my work consists of defending small municipalities and school districts, primarily in western Alaska, against civil claims such as police excessive force cases, injury claims, and teacher discipline cases. I also do some criminal defense and family law.

My wife and I are the proud parents of a son born in January of this year.

18(c) – Lawsuits. When I was the supervising attorney for the Public Defender's office in Kodiak in 1992, I was named as a defendant (along with numerous other public officials) in a lawsuit brought by a building owner challenging the procurement process for state office space for the Public Defender and District Attorney. My involvement in the procurement consisted of writing a memo to my agency's procurement officer expressing my opinion about the proposed office space. The state retained counsel to defend me, and the case was ultimately settled. The case was *Markham v. Gamache, et al*, 3KO-94-486 CI.

I was divorced in 2003 (noncontested). The case number was 1SI-03-229 CI.

I was named in a small claims case in 1991 over a court reporter's bill which remained unpaid after the dissolution of my former law firm. Both my former partner and I thought the other was taking care of the bill. When the complaint was filed I paid the bill in its entirety and the case was dismissed.

20(c). Trials: I preside over numerous court trials in federal court, typically several per month. Most of these are "petty offenses" and involve *pro se* defendants in minor cases such as traffic tickets. I have done a number of these that involved counsel on both sides and were more involved than a minor traffic offense; the most recent one I recall was a hunting violation prosecuted by Assistant U.S. Attorney Audrey Renschen, 222 W. 7th Ave., #9, Anchorage, Alaska 99513, and defended by attorney Thomas Wagner, 417 Harris Street, Juneau, Alaska 99801.
