I received a journalism degree from the University of Kansas where working for both the student newspaper and radio station helped hone my skills of investigation, research, oral communication and writing under deadline pressure.

Ms. Driscoll:

Mr. Jones was arrested in Sitka on January 27, 2015, for felony driving under the influence, felony refusal, driving with license revoked and assault four domestic violence. He has a long criminal history including a prior felony driving under the influence from 2010. If convicted in this matter, Mr. Jones will spend years in jail. I consider defense in his case a very serious matter.

Mr. Jones complains that I have unnecessarily delayed in handling his case and have failed to make specific, timely arguments upon his request. Mr. Jones' complaints are without merit.

In addition to bail and omnibus hearings, I took time in Mr. Jones case to request and conduct a representation hearing upon his demand in February and March of 2015. Mr. Jones complaint at that time was that he wanted a new attorney. He was upset because I informed him I was going file motions on his behalf to suppress evidence. Mr. Jones was unhappy because the motions would toll his right to a speedy trial. At the conclusion of the representation hearing I remained Mr. Jones' lawyer.

Mr. Jones now complains that I have been untimely in filing motions, motions which were delayed in substantial part because of Mr. Jones' own demand to have me removed as counsel. I halted work on the motions to suppress because I was not certain how the representation hearing would be resolved. It was entirely possible that the court could have permitted Mr. Jones to represent

himself. I wasn't going to put the time and energy into drafting motions for naught.

I filed the first motion to suppress for *Miranda* violations April 7, 2015. The same day I filed a second motion to suppress for lack of probable cause. On April 8, 2015, I filed a third motion to suppress for *Graham* violations. On May 28, 2015, I filed a fourth motion seeking remedies for *Copelin* violations.

The Sitka Superior court held evidentiary hearings July 1 and July 2, 2015. I was zealous in my cross examination of the police officers. Fortunately I was able to convince Mr. Jones that it would be unwise for him to testify on his own behalf. Oral argument on all four motions is set for this Monday, July 6, 2015. I am cautiously optimistic that the judge will grant at least some of the relief I have requested.
