# Alaska Judicial Council Recommendation Judge Jane F. Kauvar, District Court, Fairbanks

*I. Judicial Council Evaluation.* The Alaska Judicial Council, a non-partisan citizens commission established by the Alaska Constitution, finds Judge Kauvar to be *Qualified* and recommends unanimously (5-0) that the public vote "YES" to retain her as a district court judge.

**II.** Summary of Evaluation Information. A survey of 2,860 attorneys in Alaska rated Judge Kauvar on sixteen categories that are summarized in the adjacent graph. Attorneys rated Judge Kauvar 3.6 on a scale of 5 on overall judicial performance. She scored highest in the categories of "conduct free from impropriety" (3.9), "judicial temperament" (3.8) and "impartiality" (3.8). She scored lowest in "willingness to work diligently" (3.4).



A survey of 1,704 peace and probation officers in Alaska rated Judge Kauvar on twelve categories that are summarized in the adjacent graph. Peace and probation officers rated Judge Kauvar 4.0 on a scale of 5 on overall judicial performance. She scored highest in the categories of "conduct free from impropriety" (4.1) and "understanding and compassion" (4.1). She scored 3.9 or better in all categories.

A survey of all jurors appearing before Judge Kauvar in 2000 and 2001 rated her 4.8 on a scale of 5 on overall performance. A survey of all court employees rated her 4.2 on a scale of 5 on overall performance.

The Council also completed a background investigation including a court records check, a disciplinary records check, a review of conflict of interest statements submitted to the court system and a review of financial disclosure statements submitted to the Alaska Public Offices Commission. Attorneys, peace officers, court employees and jurors were asked to submit written comments about the judge. The Council actively encouraged the public to comment, both in writing and in a statewide public hearing teleconference.

I also volunteer to do some of the Superior Court Administrative appeals as a pro tem. These appeals include license revocations, PFD denials, and workers' compensation cases.

I served as Presiding District Court Judge for three years until I went on sabbatical. Iwas appointed by Supreme Court to sit on the Time Standards Committee, to establish guidelines for the completion of different types of cases. I served on the building

committe for the new Fairbanks Courthouse from the beginning of the project to its completion. Near the end of the project, I was also appointed to the art committee until we finished and disbanded.

#### 2. (Continued)

Recently, I was appointed to be a member of the Federal Merit Selection Panel regarding the federal magistrate position. The former magistrate passed away and the committee interviewed applicants to assist the federal judges in their selection process.

3. This past term has been very interesting and rewarding for me for a number of reasons. Presiding Judge Ralph Beistline appointed me to continue as presiding district court judge to assist him with administrative matters. In that capacity, I have served on hiring committees, monitored leave requests, and answered policy questions of the magistrates and clerks on district court matters.

In addition, I have enjoyed the challenges from my continued voluntary service as a superior court judge pro tem. A new experience for me was being appointed to preside over two first-degree murder cases. I also continued to handle other superior court criminal and civil matters as I have done for many years. In Fairbanks, the growing number of felony cases for driving while intoxicated are primarily handled by district court judges. Furthermore, at the district court level we are working to establish therapeutic courts, with the hope of offering defendants an escape from the cycle of constantly repeating court appearances. I have also been involved with a program started by the Department of Corrections to benefit the victims of crime.

After serving as a judge for almost twenty years, the Alaska Supreme Court granted me a one year sabbatical, commencing
December 1, 2000. During my sabbatical, I lived with my family
in Brisbane, Australia (January-July, 2001). While there, my
son attended one semester of high school and my daughter attended one semester of college at the University of Melbourne. I applied
and was accepted into a Masters of Law program at the T.C. Beirne
School of Law, University of Queensland. I have completed over
one-half of the credits needed to obtain my masters degree and I hope to finish the course work next summer. My courses thus far have been Evidence Law, Issues in Constitutional Law, Comparative Law, and an independent study project. The opportunity to study other legal systems was very valuable and quite refreshing. I returned to the bench in time for the Fall Judicial Conference, with a broadened perspective on the role of the judge, which has continued to benefit me in my day-to-day work.
