Alaska Judicial Council Recommendation Judge Stephanie Rhoades, District Court, Anchorage

I. Judicial Council Evaluation. The Alaska Judicial Council, a non-partisan citizens commission established by the Alaska Constitution, finds Judge Rhoades to be *Qualified* and recommends (4-1) that the public vote "YES" to retain her as a district court judge.

II. Summary of Evaluation Information. A survey of 2,860 attorneys in Alaska rated Judge Rhoades on sixteen categories that are summarized in the adjacent graph. Attorneys rated Judge Rhoades 3.6 on a scale of 5 on overall judicial performance. She scored highest in the categories of "controls courtroom" (3.9) and "promptness in making decisions" (3.9). She scored lowest in "courtesy" (3.1) and "understanding and compassion" (3.3).



Ratings are based on a one to five scale. Five is the best rating and three is "acceptable." <u>Rating Scale</u> 5.0 = Excellent 4.0 = Good 3.0 = Acceptable 2.0 = Deficient 1.0 = Unacceptable

A survey of 1,704 peace and probation officers in Alaska rated Judge Rhoades on twelve categories that are summarized in the adjacent graph. Peace and probation officers rated Judge Rhoades 4.3 on a scale of 5 on overall judicial performance. She scored highest in the category of "promptness in making decisions" (4.5). She scored 4.3 or better in all categories.

A survey of all jurors appearing before Judge Rhoades in 2000 and 2001 rated her 4.9 on a scale of 5 on overall performance. A survey of all court employees rated her 4.0 on a scale of 5 on overall performance. The CourtWatch Report prepared by Victims for Justice gave Judge Rhoades a 3.9 overall rating on a scale of 5.

The Council also completed a background investigation including a court records check, a disciplinary records check, a review of conflict of interest statements submitted to the court system and a review of financial disclosure statements submitted to the Alaska Public Offices Commission. Attorneys, peace officers, court employees and jurors were asked to submit written comments about the judge. The Council actively encouraged the public to comment, both in writing and in a statewide public hearing teleconference.



Recommendation: Vote "YES" to retain Judge Rhoades

In the past term, my satisfaction with my judicial role has increased substantially. I continue to focus on maintaining control of a high volume court process while demonstrating courtesy and respect to all parties who appear.

My specific contributions to the judiciary, the field of law and increases in my own legal knowledge and judicial skills are numerous and they are mainly summarized in the attached resume, which includes education, training, and awards that I have received in the past term, as well as presentations that I have made both nationally and locally.

Foremost among my concentrations this term were and are:

- in accordance with the time Standards for Alaska Court System Trial Courts, adopted by the Alaska Supreme Court on 2/17/00, I have become more proactive in case management of my assigned civil cases. I constructed for myself a schedule of monthly pro-active review of pending civil case assignments with an eye toward promoting earlier dispositions.
- 2) the conceptualization, development, administration and funding of a new specialty diversion court for mentally disabled offenders in the Anchorage district court: the Coordinated Resources Project . A one-page outline of this project is attached. The project is highlighted in the recent publication entitled 'Emerging Judicial Strategies for the Mentally III in the Criminal Caseload: Mental Health Court (National Criminal Justice Resource Center publication #182504, available electronically at http://www.ncjrs.org/txtfiles1/bja/182504.txt) This project is one of very few pioneer mental health court strategies that have emerged nationally. Based on the early successes that these projects have shown, federal authorization and funding legislation has passed to provide \$4 million to start more mental health courts around the country.
- Judicial outreach into the community delivering numerous presentations to local agencies and interest groups to explain the regular district court process as well as the alternate mental health court process.
