# Alaska Judicial Council Recommendation

# Judge Alex M. Swiderski, District Court, Anchorage

#### **Judicial Council Recommendation**

The Alaska Judicial Council, a non-partisan citizens commission established by the Alaska constitution, evaluates judges on criteria that include legal ability, demeanor, diligence, ability to manage their caseloads, and fairness and integrity. The Judicial Council finds Judge Swiderski to be *Qualified* and recommends unanimously that the public vote "YES" to retain him as a district court judge.

#### **Judicial Council Evaluation**

The Judicial Council surveyed 2,884 attorneys and 1,539 peace and probation officers, together with social workers/guardians ad litem, and child advocates, jurors, and court employees about the judges on the ballot. Respondents were asked to rate judicial performance and to submit comments. The Council also reviewed the ratings and observations of the Alaska Judicial Observers, independent community-based volunteers. The Council reviewed court system records concerning peremptory challenges, recusals, and appellate affirmance and reversal rates; any civil or criminal litigation involving the judge; APOC and court system conflict-of-interest statements; any public disciplinary files; and whether a judge's pay was withheld for an untimely decision. The Council investigated judicial conduct in specific cases. The Council interviewed some judges, attorneys, court staff, and others, and held a statewide public hearing to obtain comments about judges.

#### **Summary of Survey Information**

Attorneys in Alaska rated Judge Swiderski on the six categories summarized in the table above, using 5 as the highest rating possible. The attorney rating for Judge Swiderski on overall performance was 3.9. Peace and probation officers rated Judge Swiderski on five categories, using the 5-point scale above. They gave Judge Swiderski a rating of 4.0.

Three other groups also evaluated Judge Swiderski's performance, using the same 5-point scale with 5 as the highest rating. Jurors rated him 4.8 overall and court employees gave him 4.3. There were no social workers, guardians ad litem or CASA volunteers who rated Judge Swiderski. The Alaska Judicial Observers rated him 3.46.

Recommendation: Vote "YES" to retain Judge Alex M. Swiderski

Judicial Conference Planning committee which plans the two judicial training conferences held each year. Anchorage District Court Judges calendar committee (see answer to Question no. 3). One of two judges on the Anchorage Wellness Court, the drug and alcohol therapeutic court. Back-up judge for the Community Resources Project, the mental health therapeutic Court. One of two judges on a District Court Orders committee which is developing a researchable library of district court orders similar to a brief bank, for use by district court judges statewide. Magistrate Training Judge in 2007, responsible for the evaluation and training of three magistrates. The magistrate training judges also planned the annual magistrates training conference.

3. Please assess, in one or two paragraphs, your judicial performance during your present term. Appropriate areas of comment could include: satisfaction with your judicial role, specific contributions to the judiciary or the field of law, increases in legal knowledge and judicial skills, or other measures of judicial abilities that you believe to be important.

My judicial position is very satisfying. I find both criminal and civil cases rewarding. Since my appointment I believe that I have become a better judge. The position challenges me to be fair, measured, patient, and compassionate on and off the bench. While I have always pursued these virtues, I feel fortunate to have an occupation for which they are so important.

Several of the Anchorage District Court Judges have advised me that I have brought a new level of energy to the District Court bench. I initiated an effort to better deliver judicial services, including improvement of Anchorage District Court calendaring. We now have a standing calendaring committee of three judges, including myself. The committee has already implemented improvements that are appreciated by the judges as well as the attorneys who appear in district court, litigants, and court system staff. We believe there is more that can be done. I am working on a project to resolve docket issues with state misdemeanors. Historically, a large percentage of these cases have been continued and delayed multiple times before being resolved. This has been a source of frustration to the public, judges, court staff, defendants, and victims. The problems arise from discovery issues and failure to timely review and negotiate cases. I have been working with the DAs, PDs, attorneys from the Office of Public Advocacy and also the Anchorage Police Department to resolve these problems. The District Attorneys Office is implementing new discovery procedures, and I have persuaded the DAs, PDs and OPA to establish regular times to meet and confer on cases. Although many attorneys were initially resistant to the changes, they have become supportive of them as they see how these changes lead to efficient resolution of cases.

As one of the Wellness Court judges and the backup judge for the Coordinated Resources project I find the therapeutic courts to be especially rewarding. The goal of these courts is to break the ruinous patterns of repeat offenses, addictions, and other destructive behaviors through intensive treatment and monitoring of defendants. The defendants' success is gratifying and helps me be a more compassionate, patient person and judge.

With assistance from others, I organized and moderated a well-received District Court session at the last judicial training conference. I believe that the session helped judges with legal issues, and it has increased communication within the district court statewide. I have been asked to moderate a similar session at a newer judges training seminar in February 2008, and several judges have asked to repeat the format with new topics at the spring 2008 judicial conference.

#### Summary of Findings


