Judicial Council Recommendation 2010

The Alaska Judicial Council is a non-partisan citizens' commission established by the Alaska constitution. Alaskan law requires the Council to evaluate judges' performance and authorizes the Council to recommend to voters whether judges should be retained in office. The Judicial Council reviews judges' integrity, diligence, legal ability, fairness, demeanor, ability to manage their caseloads, and overall performance of their judicial responsibilities in and out of the courtroom. The Judicial Council finds Judge Estelle to be *Qualified* and recommends unanimously that the public vote "YES" to retain him as a district court judge.

Judicial Council Evaluation

The Judicial Council surveyed thousands of Alaskans including peace and probation officers, court employees, attorneys, jurors, social workers/guardians ad litem, and child advocates about the judges on the ballot. Respondents were asked to rate judicial performance and to submit comments. The Council also reviewed the ratings and observations of the Alaska Judicial Observers, independent community-based volunteers. The Council reviewed the judge's peremptory challenge, recusals, and appellate affirmance and reversal rates; any civil or criminal litigation involving the judge; APOC and court system conflict-of-interest statements; any disciplinary files involving the judge; and whether a judge's pay was withheld for an untimely decision. The Council reviewed other court records and investigated judicial conduct in specific cases. The Council interviewed some judges, attorneys, and court staff, and held a statewide public hearing to obtain comments about judges.

Summary of Survey Information

Survey respondents rated Judge Estelle on the categories summarized in the table above, using 5 as the highest rating possible. The attorney rating for Judge Estelle on overall performance was 3.6. Peace and probation officers gave Judge Estelle a rating of 4.0. Jurors rated him 4.9 overall, court employees gave him 3.7, and social workers, guardians ad litem and CASA volunteers rated him at 5.0.

I love working in the Palmer District Court and am very satisfied by the help we provide to the public. This is the "ounce of prevention" court. We deal with the majority of the courts' cases, 80% of the criminal cases, and deal with the widest variety of human misfortune. I look, in each case, for a "silver lining" under the theory that each is an opportunity for the person to get the education, skills and tools that help them avoid coming back to court as a party. I am privileged to serve the community where I was born and raised. As the Matanuska and Susitna Valleys have grown in population, the court filings also have grown proportionately.

Managing growth through innovations such as our "Evening Court" for traffic matters and Small Claims cases was well received by those citizens and officers who are either working or sleeping during the daytime court hours. In addition, our Mental Health Court process (Palmer Coordinated Resources Project or CRP) has been a huge success. It provides a treatment-oriented alternative to the regular Misdemeanor Trial and Jail phases. We are expanding it to include low-level non-violent felonies involving defendants with mental health issues. To participate, these folks must commit to a long-term treatment plan. Then, the CRP case manager provides an appropriate level of treatment-oriented structure and support. The court has brief, regular, periodic review hearings to assess progress. There, the court reviews achievements, any temporary set backs and future plans. After hearing from the parties and professionals, the court may order adjustments in levels or frequency of contacts. Patience, respect and understanding go a long way toward helping these people to see their way out of trouble and to a better future, not only for them but for the community, families, victims and others involved. Looking forward, I hope to continue to serve my community and do what I can to improve the quality of outcomes and the quality of legal practice in the Palmer Trial Courts.

Along with the personal observations of the hundreds of people who had direct professional experience with the judge, the Council reviews any litigation involving the judge, conflict of interest records, public disciplinary files, and indicators of judicial performance such as appellate affirmances and reversals, and peremptory challenges and recusals.
