2. Please describe your participation in court/bar committees or other administrative activities during your current term of office:

I am the Chairperson of the Judicial Wellness and Continuing Development Committee. We have been involved with the sensitive issue of creating a Judicial Assistance Committee, which has required personal interaction by me and Susanne DiPietro with both the Alaska Supreme Court and the Commission on Judicial Conduct. The goal is to have a resource for possibly impaired judges that mirrors that already available for lawyers. I also serve on the Court's CINA/Delinquency Rules Committee. Chief Justice Carpeneti appointed me as the Court System representative to the Alaska FASD Partnership, and I serve on its Steering Committee. I also serve on the governor-appointed Alaska Juvenile Justice Advisory Committee.

Appropriate areas of comment could include: satisfaction with your judicial role, specific contributions to the judiciary or the field of law, increases in legal knowledge and judicial skills, or other measures of judicial abilities that you feel are important.

Having served as the Superior Court Judge in Barrow (either active or pro tem) full-time since December 1982, I continue to believe that the Court must adapt as much as possible to provide understandable and meaningful service to the community. I believe everyone is a child of God, and deserves basic respect from an agency such as the Alaska Court System. I have become especially aware of how hidden cognitive impairments—especially those caused by Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorders-affect the justice system in so many ways. Since the current situation in rural Alaska is that we almost never have a diagnosis, and yet there is a very good chance that a significant number of participants are affected, I continue to try to adapt to this reality. I will slow down the hearings, address participants directly and make sure they understand what is going on and use forms like Bail Orders and Probation Conditions for adults and Conduct Agreements and Probation Orders for juveniles that are written in a positive manner, with clear English and areas for people to show their understanding by initialing each condition. This additional court time impacts makes my workdays busy, forcing work on many weekends and evenings in addition to my normal rotation of weekend/holiday duty for arraignments and emergency hearings.

I have presented on the subject of adapting to FASD in the courtroom in several locations in Alaska as well as internationally at a conference in Vancouver, B.C. My article "An Arctic Judge's Journey with FASD" has been published in the Winter 2010 special issue on FASD of the Journal of Psychiatry and the Law. I am humbled by recognition from the Supreme Court with the Community Outreach Award in 2011 and from the Alaska Bar Association for the Judge Nora Quinn Award for "extraordinary or sustained effort" to assist Alaska's rural residents, especially native residents, "to overcome language and cultural barriers to obtaining justice through the legal system." Even though my retirement will be required by law in a few years, I hope to continue these efforts to have the legal system serve those interacting with it in a fair and understandable manner. I also intend to maintain active involvement in the community through my faith community, Barrow's Rotary Club, Eskimo dance group membership and volunteerism in the schools. I enjoy doing outreach activities when I am

I have made an effort to visit most of the correctional facilities in Alaska and to learn about the rehabilitative programs available at the facilities. My membership over many years in the Alaska Juvenile Justice Advisory Committee has provided a similar opportunity to visit juvenile detention and treatment facilities in addition to visits I have made on my own. The AJJAC also has a program of "focus groups" in which AJJAC members can sit down with youth in detention or institutional placements as well as youth in treatment programs, and talk to them about their experience with juvenile justice (including the court). I have also visited the Lakeside Milam Recovery Center in Kirkland, Washington. This program has a contractual relationship for 28-day residential alcohol/substance abuse treatment with the North Slope Borough and many defendants and parents in CINA treatment plans attend that program. I find it extremely useful to be able to share with hearing participants that I have visited various programs that we are discussing.

## Alaska Judicial Council Recommendation

## Judge Michael I. Jeffery, Superior Court, Barrow

#### **Judicial Council Recommendation 2012**

The Alaska Judicial Council is a non-partisan citizens' commission established by the Alaska constitution. Alaskan law requires the Council to evaluate judges' performance and authorizes the Council to recommend to voters whether judges should be retained in office. The Judicial Council reviews judges' integrity, diligence, legal ability, fairness, demeanor, ability to manage their caseloads, and overall performance of their judicial responsibilities in and out of the courtroom. The Judicial Council finds Judge Jeffery to be *Qualified* and recommends unanimously that the public vote "YES" to retain him as a superior court judge.

#### **Judicial Council Evaluation**

The Judicial Council surveyed thousands of Alaskans including peace and probation officers, court employees, attorneys, jurors, social workers and guardians ad litem about the judges on the ballot. Respondents were asked to rate judicial performance and to submit comments. The Council also reviewed the ratings and observations of the Alaska Judicial Observers, independent community-based volunteers. The Council reviewed the judge's peremptory challenge, recusals, and appellate affirmance and reversal rates; any civil or criminal litigation involving the judge; APOC and court system conflict-of-interest statements; any disciplinary files involving the judge; and whether a judge's pay was withheld for an untimely decision. The Council reviewed other court records and investigated judicial conduct in specific cases. The Council interviewed some judges, attorneys, and court staff, and held a statewide public hearing to obtain comments about judges.

#### **Summary of Survey Information**

Survey respondents rated Judge Jeffery on the categories summarized in the table above, using 5 as the highest rating possible. The attorney rating for Judge Jeffery on overall performance was 4.6. Peace and probation officers gave Judge Jeffery a rating of 3.6. Jurors rated him 4.1 overall, court employees gave him 4.6, and social workers and guardians ad litem rated him at 5.0.

Recommendation: Vote "YES" to retain Judge Michael I. Jeffery
