I have continued to enjoy and to find fulfillment in my work as a superior court judge. The mix of cases in Palmer provides an excellent opportunity to work in a wide variety of fields of law, as well as to make a significant contribution to the community.

One of the more interesting areas of work for me has been in criminal sentencing. I have consistently looked for ways in which to make sentences more effective in meeting the sentencing goals. One of the most important new sentencing approaches which I have explored is that of circle sentencing, which features community participation in the process of defining the relevant sentence. I conducted such a sentencing procedure in Glenallen in a case involving two young men who had stolen and destroyed a community fire truck. The entire community participated in an open discussion of the impact of that crime on the community itself and on the families of the defendants, a process which I believe had a positive impact on the two defendants (they both burst into tears) and should lead to a better chance at rehabilitation.

I have done a lot of work in locations other than Palmer. Together with another judge, I cover the entire calendar for the Cordova court. I also am assigned to hear all cases in the Glenallen and Valdez courts which involve Class A and Unclassified felonies or felonies in which domestic violence or sexual assault or abuse is charged; I also hear on all cases from which the judge sitting in Valdez is preempted. In addition, I have worked as a Training Judge for magistrates in Glenallen, Naknek, Dutch Harbor, and Seward -- this entails both travel to those locations for an on-site review as well as ongoing availability to assist those magistrates with any issues that may arise. Finally, I recently completed a five-week civil trial in Bethel at the request of the Fourth Judicial District. This work has provided substantial benefits to the court system. It also has broadened my understanding through exposure to different communities and different cultures.

Finally, I was recently appointed to be the Chairman of the Criminal Pattern Instruction Committee, which is charged with developing pattern instructions for use in criminal cases. This has been a fascinating experience, as we spend a great deal of time debating the substantive criminal law so as best to develop an accurate instruction for judges to use. We also have set out to write the instructions in much plainer English, a process which cannot but help me explain my own rulings in a more understandable way.

Alaska Judicial Council Recommendation

Judge Eric Smith, Superior Court, Palmer

Judicial Council Recommendation 2012

The Alaska Judicial Council is a non-partisan citizens' commission established by the Alaska constitution. Alaskan law requires the Council to evaluate judges' performance and authorizes the Council to recommend to voters whether judges should be retained in office. The Judicial Council reviews judges' integrity, diligence, legal ability, fairness, demeanor, ability to manage their caseloads, and overall performance of their judicial responsibilities in and out of the courtroom. The Judicial Council finds Judge Smith to be **Qualified** and recommends unanimously that the public vote "YES" to retain him as a superior court judge.

Judicial Council Evaluation

The Judicial Council surveyed thousands of Alaskans including peace and probation officers, court employees, attorneys, jurors, social workers and guardians ad litem about the judges on the ballot. Respondents were asked to rate judicial performance and to submit comments. The Council also reviewed the ratings and observations of the Alaska Judicial Observers, independent community-based volunteers. The Council reviewed the judge's peremptory challenge, recusals, and appellate affirmance and reversal rates; any civil or criminal litigation involving the judge; APOC and court system conflict-of-interest statements; any disciplinary files involving the judge; and whether a judge's pay was withheld for an untimely decision. The Council reviewed other court records and investigated judicial conduct in specific cases. The Council interviewed some judges, attorneys, and court staff, and held a statewide public hearing to obtain comments about judges.

Summary of Survey Information

Survey respondents rated Judge Smith on the categories summarized in the table above, using 5 as the highest rating possible. The attorney rating for Judge Smith on overall performance was 4.3. Peace and probation officers gave Judge Smith a rating of 4.6. Jurors rated him 4.8 overall, court employees gave him 4.6, and social workers and guardians ad litem rated him at 3.8. The Alaska Judicial Observers rated him 3.28.
