4. Please describe any public outreach activities during your current term in office.

Therapeutic court stakeholder groups--The district court therapeutic courts rely almost exclusively on government and community treatment providers to provide services for our participants. These organizations include the Mental Health Trust Authority, Department of Corrections, Alaska Behavior Health Services. Southcentral Foundation Behavioral Health, Hope Community Resources, Akeela Inc., Cook Inlet Tribal Council, Salvation Army Clitheroe Center, API, Chris Kyle Patriots Hospital, Veterans Administration, and many others.

The therapeutic courts cannot function without these outside agencies and providers. The CRP and Wellness Court stakeholders groups meet with their directors; work with their providers in and out of the courtroom; learn about their operations; discuss their needs and concerns; develop policies and procedures which take into account their input; and maintain longterm goodwill.

I am proud of the way the Alaska Court System staff, and Anchorage judges dealt with three years of pandemic-related court restrictions. We all came to work every day with the goal of making our courtrooms as accessible as possible. While trials were few and far between, we were able to continue presiding over the many thousands of other cases which came before us. Conditions were not ideal, but the entire group (especially our staff) worked very hard to make sure the courthouse remained as "public" as possible.

When we were given the go-ahead to try and re-start jury trials (with many restrictions), judges showed up in each others courtrooms with with tape measures and Velcro markers, and endlessly re-arranged furniture to meet social distancing requirements. The final product often stretched the definition of a "jury box" to extremes--in some courtrooms we had attorneys in the jury box, and jurors spread around the courtroom. But we were pleasantly surprised that our "Rube Goldberg" creations worked, and with the positive response we received from jurors.

This sort of creativity was also demonstrated by our staff on a daily basis as they adjusted to "virtual" courtrooms. As difficult as it was for them, I was continually amazed at how calm and professional they remained in the courtroom.

As a group, we kept focused on our goal of providing maximum access to the court, while maintaining a safe environment for staff and customers. Everyone contributed to the effort, and we did some great things during trying times.

Early on, I was advised to not volunteer for them for a year; but instead focus on learning how to be a judge. I took that advice. Once the year was up, I volunteered for Wellness Court, and later added CRP. I greatly appreciate having had the opportunity to work in these courts as a judge.
