I am a conference speaker/ educator on Implicit Bias & Racial Disparities in the Courts, Addressing Lawyer Competency and Effectiveness, and Importance of Judicial Community Outreach.

I attend the annual Reducing Recidivism & Reentry Conference each year and various Alaska Therapeutic Court Trainings. I receive education and training on best practice in the treatment of Mental Health, Addiction, Trauma, FASD, and the use of Medication Assisted Treatment.

I have been on the bench 13 years and in this judicial term. I have seen and experienced the publics' fustration with increasing discord and distrust of all branches of government, including the Judicial Branch, like never before. Our communities want answers and assurances that the administration of justice is fair and impartial. and that Judges can be trusted. As co-chair of the Alaska Supreme Court's Fairness, Diversity, and Equality Committee, and Cultural Competency Sub-Committee, I have played a role in bringing awareness to the issue of unconscious bias and how it can impact judicial decision making. I was part of drafting and implementing a Supereme Court policy requiring judicial education on Implicit bias & Cultural Competency to be included at all Judical Conferences. As Vice President of Districts for the National Assoication of Women Judges, I helped developed an education program called Racial Disparities in the Courts which has been widely used by courts across the nation. I have presented the educational program for judge audiences on webinars and in person in Washington DC, Nashville, Tennessee, and here at home at our 22 Fall Judicial Conference in Girdwood, Alaska. I was asked by the Alaska Bar Association to write a position article about making implicit bias education and training a mandatory Continuing Legal Education (CLE) for the bar. The article, " Understanding implicit bias is a matter for mandatory CLE" was published in the January - March 2022 issue of The Alaska Bar Rag.

The pandemic has brought us challenges but increased our use of technology and appreciation of its impact on Access to Justice. As the Deputy Presiding Judge for the Anchorage District Court, I have enjoyed having a hybrid courtroom while educating and encouraging my colleagues to upgrade their courtrooms too. The public has greated access to justice when they can appear by ZOOM or telephonically when they cannot appear in-person.

I continue to be deliberate in working to ensure public trust in the administration of justice. I am intentional about making sure litigants do not feel rushed through the process. I take the time to give each person the opportunity to be heard and the chance to have the court process explained. I always endeavor to be patient and respectful in my interactions with my colleagues, court staff, and the public. I still enjoy my work and appreciate the opportunity to serve the community on and off the bench.
