

I have represented oil companies and gold miners, consumer classes, the Alaska Court System, non-profits, public employee unions, and many small businesses and individuals. My appeal work just over the past few years has involved, among other things, domestic violence orders, partnership disputes, bank lending practices, workers' compensation, spoliation of evidence, the Wage and Hour Act, and many subsidiary issues of evidence and procedure. I am gratified when colleagues call me for appellate advice (and even more gratified when I can give it) and am honored when I'm asked to pursue an appeal in a case that another lawyer tried below.

A significant part of my practice has been insurance defense. One aspect of this work that sets it apart from others is the dual nature of the representation. On the one hand, I'm working with claims professionals who deal with litigation for a living and can be very objective about its costs and risks. On the other hand, my clients are often homeowners or business people who have never been sued before,

are apprehensive about the process, and more than anything need assurance that their case is in competent hands and that the system works. Guiding the layperson through the process to a just (if not always happy) conclusion, and explaining why it happened the way it did so that the client can live with the result, is a fundamental part of every general civil practice, and it is an experience that I would remember on the bench.

In 2006, the Alaska Bar Association gave me the Board of Governors Professionalism Award, which purports to recognize "exemplary conduct in [my] association with the public, [my] colleagues and the legal community." I don't know what criteria, if any, exist for the award, but I hope that it reflects the notion that quite a few of my fellow lawyers have faith in my integrity, judgment, and commitment to the respectability of the profession. I have also been named as a "Best Lawyer" and "Super Lawyer" in several peer-selected lists published by different ranking organizations, which (I think) means that other lawyers feel comfortable referring their clients to me.

Finally, while I am not under any illusion that Supreme Court Justices have the luxury of sitting in their offices and writing clever things all day (not to say that they couldn't if they had the time), writing has always been one of my joys. I get great satisfaction from a well-researched and well-written pleading; particularly if, as an added bonus, my client's position is a strong one. I hope that on the Supreme Court I could convey a sense of a just result in readable form.
